Getting Started

Introductions

Set up circle and pocket chart. Introduce Circlekeepers, Sacred Stories, and current theme. ID groups; pass out bags with materials; participants make nametags.

Attendance

Take attendance, greet participants, distribute bonus items as appropriate: folders and brochures to first-timers, certificate to four-timers, book to six-timers.

Explain the Talking Piece

For some of the activities in Sacred Stories class we use a talking piece. The talking piece creates a space in which everyone can speak and listen in peace. Each person in the circle gets a chance to speak without being interrupted,

and to listen without needing to respond.

When we are using a talking piece, here is how it works:

- 1. The talking piece is passed around the circle from person to person.
- 2. Only the person holding the talking piece may speak.
- 3. It is always okay to pass; just say, "I pass."

Check-In Round

Today our talking piece is: Joseph, angel

We will use it for a check-in round; when the talking piece comes to you please...

- 1. Say your name
- 2. How familiar you are with this story (new, heard before, could tell)
- 3. A word or more about how you are feeling today

I'll go first...

Agreements Round

These are the four agreements for our time together:

- 1. Honor the talking piece—when it is being used, speak only when you are holding it
- 2. Speak from the heart—tell your truth as you are comfortable to share
- 3. Listen from the heart—be attentive, with a positive spirit; avoid side conversations, comments or questions.
- 4. Protect personal privacy—Tell about God, Jesus, this class and the story we learn, but keep confidential personal information that is shared

Opening: The Presentation and the Story

Present Journey to Bethlehem for Week 3 of Advent (Joseph). Tell Matthew 1:18-25

Engaging the Story

□ Familiarity

Word I Heard

Listen again to the story of the Annunciation to Joseph.

This time close your eyes or focus on the candle to help cut out distractions. As you listen, notice if any word or phrase gets your attention... *Read or tell* Before you open your eyes, recall a word or phrase that got your attention... *Ring chime*... Now open your eyes.

For this round, name a word or phrase that you heard in the reading/telling.

□ Storyboard → Tell to a Partner

Structure of the Story

- The first episode in this story is the crisis of Mary's conception and of Joseph's response.
- The second episode is the dream and the address of the angel to Joseph.
- The third episode is the prophecy--these are the words of Isaiah so you can give Isaiah in this episode a distinctive voice or gesture if you choose.
- And the fourth episode is the birth and the naming.

Name a Part

For this round, pick one episode of the story to tell about—the one you found most interesting, meaningful, or that is your favorite illustration. Show us your storyboard if you like.

Verbal Threads

- 1. The name of Jesus
 - a. Part 1-first sentence: "the birth of Jesus, the Messiah"
 - b. Part 2-the angel commands Joseph "you are to name him Jesus"
 - c. Part 4-the story ends with Joseph obeying: "and he named him Jesus"
 - d. Note part 3 has a naming feature: not Jesus, but Emmanuel
- 2. The child Mary has conceived is "from the Holy Spirit"— parts 1 and 2.

□ About the Story

Read topics on About the Story *handout—go around circle so each woman can read a paragraph; use talking piece for easy opt-out.*

Show illustration of wedding feast and procession on pp. 12-13 of Everyday Life

Connections

Each person has an opportunity to respond to possible connections between the story and their life experience.

Connection topics are named by the Circlekeeper (see handout for options).

Winding Up

Prayer Cards

Collection

Gather all the items in the Circle and those passed out which need to be returned.

Closing

Standing in the Circle, conclude with prayer and/or song such as "Go Now in Peace."
